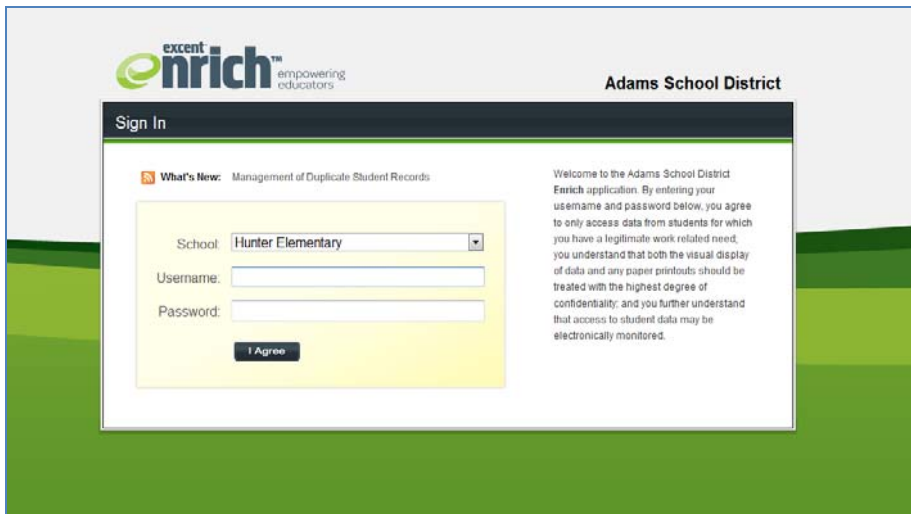
Enrich: A New Name for TestView

VC3 has formed a partnership with Excent, providers of the Excent Online product. This partnership combines Excent's 15+ years of experience in Special Education with VC3's 15+ years of experience building and supporting software solutions. The result of this partnership is the Enrich product suite, which is based on the TestView platform. What does that mean for you today? The only immediate change is the new name and look of the Testview product. In the coming months, you will hear more details about the addition of a Special Education component for managing IEPs, which will eventually replace Excent Online in all South Carolina districts.

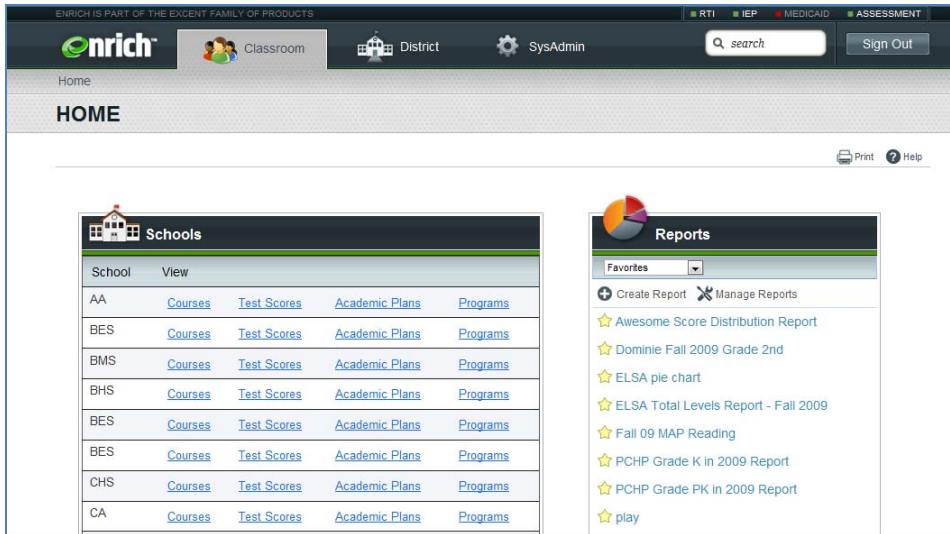
Enhanced User Interface

Our newly refreshed user interface is the first thing you will notice. You'll see the same options and links in the same locations as before.

The login page has the same elements, but gives you a preview of the new Enrich color scheme:



The Classroom page (or Home page) has the same layout as before. However, you'll see new icons and brighter colors to help users identify the various sections of functionality.



At the top of each page, you'll see a thin bar listing the components of the Enrich product suite: RtI, IEP, Medicaid, and Assessment. IEP is in development now. A green indicator by each name indicates active components in your system. Clicking on any of these names will open an information box describing the product suite. You may close it by clicking the Close link at the top right corner.

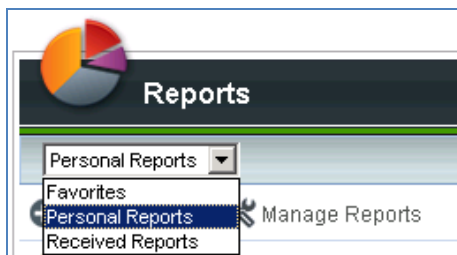


Reports Management

Some enhancements have been made to the appearance of your existing reports and the way you manage them.



First, you'll see that your Favorites are marked with yellow stars. You may "un-mark" a Favorite by simply clicking on the star to the left of the report name. This will remove that report from your Favorites list. You may view all your personal reports – that is, those reports created by you – by selecting Personal reports from the drop-down list:



From this list you may mark a report as a Favorite by clicking the white star (see below).



Select Received Reports from the drop-down list to see all reports that have been shared to you by other users.

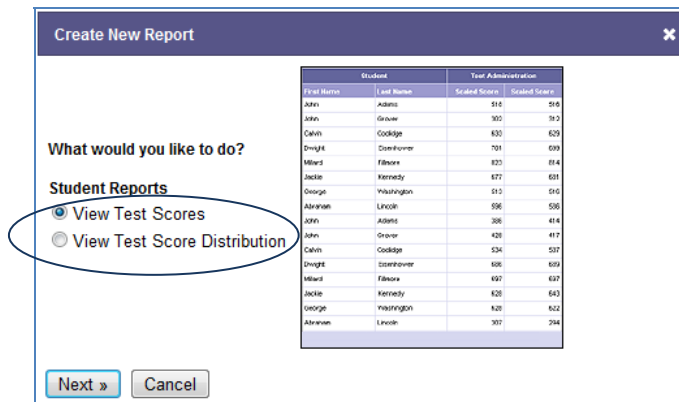
Click **Manage Reports** to see ALL reports (Favorites, Personal and Received reports) in one list. It is here that you may **delete** any Personal or Favorite reports you no longer need.

Note: You may also see a number of template reports, that are shared from the user “System”. These reports, like other shared reports, are not deletable.

Creating Reports

The reports area has been expanded so that we can support reports for the optional RTI module and future IEP module. When you click Create Report, you’ll see a new screen. The key difference is that instead of seeing this dialog....



...you’ll see the screen below. Note that the two options in the above dialog (View Test Scores and View Test Score Distribution) are the same options as those under the Blank Reports heading in the screen below (Test Score Details and Test Score Distribution).

Detailed results of student assessments. Useful for longitudinal assessment analysis.

[Test Score Distribution](#)

Frequency distribution of student test scores. Can be used to analyze student achievement in aggregate. Data can also be disaggregated into more specific groupings, such as ethnicity and gender, which is useful for APY reporting.

Clicking these two options will take you to the same Report Criteria pages that you are accustomed to using. The process of defining report criteria, running and saving reports is the same as before:
